



SHOI Practice Types and Practice Sites

Your SHOI obligation requires that you practice at a SHOI approved practice site, for a minimum of 32 hours per week of clinical practice for a total of 45 weeks in a 52 week period, for the entire length of your SHOI commitment. You must receive written confirmation from the Office of Rural health that a practice site qualifies for SHOI before signing an employment contract with a practice site.

If you should you chose to practice in an urban area it must be at a SHOI approved practice site in a primary care capacity. Inpatient work in not allowed while you are under your SHOI obligation, no matter the practice site's location or qualification status.

For the purpose of SHOI "primary care" is defined as:

- Physicians: Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, Pediatrics, OB/GYN, Geriatrics
- Physician Assistants: Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, Pediatrics, OB/GYN, Geriatrics
- **Dentists:** General Dentistry
- Nurse Practitioners: Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, Pediatrics, OB/GYN, Nurse Midwives, Adult Gerontology Acute Nurse Practitioner, Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner

Activities not listed above are not considered primary care and will be limited a SHOI approved practice site located in a designated rural area in Oregon.
