## **Family Tip Sheet: Getting Started**

Some parents prefer to wait a few weeks but most find it helpful to take these steps in the next several days. Remember, your Parent Partner will be there to help if you need it.

### **Contact Important Services**

Your child's health care provider. Schedule an appointment to review the results of the team evaluation.
Early Intervention (EI) Services. In your community call: Say, "My child has
ust been diagnosed by the Autism Identification Team. I would like to get him started with Early
Intervention." If your child is already receiving EI services, make sure to review the results of the
team evaluation with your child's EI provider.
Community Developmental Disability Services. In your county, call
Say, "My child has just been diagnosed with Autism by the autism identification team. I would
like to speak to your eligibility coordinator about enrolling for Developmental Disabilities
Services." Supplemental Social Security Income.
