

22q Deletion Syndrome AKA 22q11.2 Deletion Syndrome

22q11.2 deletion syndrome, or 22q deletion syndrome is a birth anomaly that happens when a small piece of chromosome 22 is missing. The genes of the human body, which are the instruction set of how the body is built, come in 26 pairs of chromosomes. 22q deletion syndrome ("deletion" means "missing") can affect almost any part of the body and how it works. Many children with 22q deletion syndrome have developmental delays, including slow physical growth, a hard time learning to speak well, and learning disabilities.
