

# Anophthalmia/Microphthalmia

Anophthalmia/microphthalmia (an-əf-'thal-mē-ə/mī-,kräf-'thal-mē-ə) are birth anomalies of the eyes. In anophthalmia, a baby is born without one or both eyes. In microphthalmia, one or both eyes are small because they do not develop all the way. Anophthalmia and microphthalmia happen as the baby is developing during pregnancy, and can happen with or without other anomalies. Children with anophthalmia are blind in the affected eye(s).
