

Bladder Extrophy

Bladder exstrophy is a birth anomaly of the bladder and the front bones of the pelvis. In most cases, the baby is born with the bladder outside of the body. Instead of being a normal balloon shape, the bladder can be in two halves that are inside-out. This makes the bladder unable to store urine (pee) made by the kidneys. The pubic bones at the front of the pelvis normally join to protect and support the bladder and the muscles of the outer belly wall. In children with bladder exstrophy, the pubic bones do not join, leaving a wide opening between the bones. The urethra, the tube from the bladder that allows urine to leave the body, also does not form properly. This means these babies also need their lower urinary tract and their external genitals repaired by surgery.
