

# Rectal or Large Intestinal Atresia

Rectal and large intestinal atresia/stenosis is a group of rare birth anomalies of the lower intestines in which they are narrowed, blocked, or disconnected. If they are "rectal", that means it occurs in the anus, from which poop passes out of the body. If they are "large intestinal", that means it occurs in the large bowel, which is the structure in which poop is formed before passing through the anus. "Atresia" means that part of the rectum or large intestine did not form at all. "Stenosis" means that the part is too narrow. These conditions are sometimes detected before birth.
