What is Telehealth?

Telehealth, what is it?

Many of us are staying at home to stay safe from the Coronavirus, which causes COVID-19.

Our friends and family are staying home too.

That means we can't visit them or have them visit us at home - but...

we can still visit with them
On the phone

Or

by using a computer, tablet, or Smartphone.

The camera on these devices lets us see each other while we talk and visit - sort of like a video.

When we meet using video, we call it a 'virtual meeting' or, a 'video meeting'

Healthcare workers like doctors, nurses, and therapists are staying at home to stay safe too.

But what if we need to see our Healthcare Worker?

Well, we can also have a virtual meeting, or video meeting, with that person.

It can be over the phone...

OR

By using a computer, tablet, or smartphone.

A virtual (or video) meeting with healthcare workers is called TELEHEALTH.

With Telehealth, we can ask our healthcare worker questions; tell them if we feel sick or have pain; ask them about our medicine, get information or anything we need to stay healthy.
