What is HERO Kids Registry?



- Voluntary, no-cost system
- Any Oregon family can share critical information about their child's or young adult's health before a health emergency occurs
- The information can be quickly and easily accessed by emergency medical services (EMS) and hospital emergency department (ED) providers





Who is HERO Kids for?

- Any Oregon child or young adult up through age 26
- Especially useful for young people with:
 - Complicated or chronic health conditions
 - Those who experience developmental disabilities or mental health conditions



Families and providers working together

HERO Kids Registry was designed by parents and professionals **working together** over several years to improve the emergency medical experience.



It can be hard to think clearly and remember details in an emergency.

Knowing that first responders have the information they need ahead of time may lead to better collaboration at the scene.



Why should EMS access the Registry?

- HERO Kids Registry gives EMS and emergency department providers a head start on understanding a child's or young adult's medical history and unique needs
- The Registry also shares information that can help with care or comfort
- For example, you might learn:
 - That an infant in respiratory distress has a known difficult airway
 - That a child with a seizure disorder is non-responsive to typical seizure controlling medications



What information can EMS get from the Registry?

- Medical and/or behavioral conditions
- Alerts
- Medications
- POLST Information
- Approach considerations

- Allergies
- Safe words
- Hospital preference
- Parent or legal guardian contact information



HERO Kids registration form

- Families and young adults will be able to print a copy for their records
- EMS and EDs will access this form and additional instructions
 - Emergency Protocol letter
 - Emergency Information Form for Children with Special Needs

How does the Registry work?


- In an emergency, the person calling 911 will give the dispatcher or arriving EMS the HERO Kids Registry ID number, or tell them that the child or young adult is registered
- Once EMS and ED providers know a child or young adult is registered, they will call a confidential provider line or connect though Emergency Department Information Exchange or EMS app.

The information will be available in fewer than 90 seconds.



Who can access the HERO Kids Registry, and is it secure?

Hero Kids Registry is a secure, HIPAA-compliant database. It is operated by Registry staff trained to comply with all health privacy laws. To protect privacy and confidentiality, only the following people can access the Registry:



- The parent or legal guardian who registers their child or young adult
- The young adult who self registers
- HERO Kids Registry staff
- EMS and ED providers who are treating the child or young adult



How to help families learn more about HERO Kids
