

Qualifications

U.S. graduates of either accredited 3- or 4-year Emergency Medicine or 3-year Pediatric residency programs are welcome to apply. American Board of Emergency Medicine (ABEM) requires a minimum of 2 years of fellowship training. Pediatric graduates are required by American Board of Pediatrics (ABP) to complete 3 years of training with the same opportunity for an advanced degree.

The curriculum is designed to meet board requirements but remains highly flexible to meet individual needs. Applicants with an interest in taking an active role in their training are encouraged to apply.

This program participates in the National Resident Matching Program (NRMP). We use the Electronic Residency Application Service application system and the NRMP to appoint Pediatric Emergency Medicine fellows. A limited number of applicants will be invited to interview in Portland in the fall every year.
